The characters are vividly and naturally portrayed, dressed differently and with very different looks, and the dancers in several of the paintings have a light and very natural posture(Zhu,2018). The "Miao Albums" of the Qing Dynasty is a map or atlas that depicts and records the Miao region, often containing information on geography, ethnicity, customs, culture and other aspects (Li, Meng,2018). The study of the traditional sports and cultural elements of ethnic minorities contained in the "Miao Albums" of the Qing Dynasty reveals the significance of sports in the cultural and social life of the Miao people. Sports are often practiced in groups or teams, encouraging cooperation, teamwork and a sense of belonging among participants (Amiel,2023). This provides an opportunity for Miao people to come together, bond and strengthen their relationships. Not only do these physical activities help the Miao people stay healthy and strong, but they also serve as a form of military defense and self-defense training (Qin Weiqi,2021). Many depictions of traditional sports activities of ethnic minorities, such as archery (Vendrame,2022), javelin throwing (Cuciorovschi,2023), wrestling (Molnár,2022), dancing (Hu Yingzhen,2022), and mountain climbing (Chinnasamy, 2022), can be seen in these atlases. The vivid depictions and inheritance of traditional sports activities in the "Miao Albums" have a very positive reference value and promote the development of contemporary traditional sports activities.

#### **METETHOD**

This study takes the traditional sports culture of ethnic minorities in the Qing Dynasty, and uses literature research and image visual analysis methods.

First, the literature research method. Through consulting the relevant historical documents, local customs, ethnography, to understand the historical background, cultural customs and sports activities of the Miao society in the Qing Dynasty. This article focuses on five main sports activities: archery, javelin throwing, wrestling, dancing, and mountain climbing. These activities are not only forms of entertainment and leisure, but also have profound cultural significance for the Miao people. By examining the depictions of these sports in the Qing Dynasty's "Miao Albums," we can better understand the values, beliefs, and traditions of the Miao people. The development and transmission of sports activities such as archery, javelin throwing, wrestling, dancing and mountaineering not only demonstrate the people's pursuit of physical skills, but also embody the values of honor, bravery and respect for tradition.

### **Archery**

Archery is a traditional skill of many ethnic minorities, and it is a common traditional sporting activity in the "Miao Albums. In Miao culture, archery is a skill that has been passed down from generation to generation and is often used for hunting and traditional ceremonies. Practicing archery requires precision, accuracy, and concentration, and is considered an honor and a sign of respect for traditional culture.

In the picture above, you can see the scene where the Miao people are hunting, in the picture one person is holding a stone high, two people are holding a javelin, one person is focusing on using a crossbow, and the bottom person is specializing in hunting with archery when facing the prey from a long distance on the land. This shows that the Miao people in the Qing Dynasty were good at hunting with all kinds of tools, and knew how to utilize everyone's skills to their advantage, supporting each other in the culture of good living.

Figure 2 differs from Figure 1 in that it can be seen that when chasing prey, the Miao people of the Qing Dynasty were good at using horseback riding on their prey and possessed the ability to shoot arrows on horseback. Riding and archery are less recorded in the Qing Dynasty Miao map, but from the above figure, we can find that the Miao people in the Qing Dynasty were flexible in the use of archery, which is an important cultural reference value for the development of the subsequent riding and archery sports programs.

#### Javelin

Javelin is the most common Miao hunting method in the Qing Dynasty "Miao Albums". In the "Miao Albums", Miao men, sometimes on the ground, sometimes on horseback, use javelins for hunting. Javelin throwing not only shows the strength and concentration of Miao men, but also the primitive way of life of the Miao people at that time to get food. The javelin throwing element in the "Miao Albums" provides very important historical and cultural information for javelin throwing in modern sports.

In Figure 3, you can see two Miao people holding javelins and running in the direction of their prey, concentrating on finding an opportunity to get ready to throw the javelins in their hands at their prey. Their javelin-throwing posture is very similar to that of the javelin in modern track and field sports. The throwing technique of javelin in modern track and field sports is to hold the javelin on the shoulder, and after a period of pre-assisted running and connecting the throwing step to gain momentum, the javelin will be thrown over the shoulder through the explosive final force acting on the longitudinal axis of the javelin(Lu Gang,2022). You can see the Miao people in dark-colored clothes on the way formally adopting the javelin movement throwing method, ready to surrender the javelin in their hands to the prey. The javelin has evolved from a way of hunting for the Miao people to a contemporary sport, which is not only an inheritance of skills and techniques, but also of traditional culture and an effective way of storing ancient memories.

Depicted in Figure 4 are five Miao people carrying javelins on their shoulders as they prepare to go on a road trip in search of prey. Their strong bodies can be seen in the drawing, as well as their harmonious state of walking and discussing at the same time. They are not going to prepare for the task of hunting, but rather enjoying the process of going hunting with javelins in hand and with their hunting comrades. Such traditional cultural elements of sports are not only important references for the development of sports programs, but also important guides for the cultural health and further thinking of sports programs.

### Wrestling

In "Miao Albums", wrestling is a common form of dispute resolution, symbolizing strength, skill, bravery and honour. In traditional Miao culture, wrestling matches are often part of dispute resolution, festivals and celebrations, in which men demonstrate their physical prowess and compete for prestige. The depictions of wrestling in Miao Albums reflect the value placed on physical strength and masculinity in Miao society.

have developed fair competition mechanisms and comparison rules for wrestling, including movement techniques that have specialized movement skill operation processes. This not only greatly reduces the risk of major injuries, but also inherits wrestling as a sport that demonstrates human strength. The cultural elements of wrestling depicted in the above Miao picture not only vividly show us the sense of strength of the Miao people during the Qing Dynasty, but also show us the vigor and courage of the Miao people.

### **Dancing**

Dancing is an important part of the traditional culture of many ethnic minorities and is a common element of sport in the "Miao Albums". Dance is not only a form of artistic expression, but also a way of strengthening social ties and identity.
